From the Desk of Fr. Kurpios

June 26, 2016

Today, the Gospel invites us to ponder over our following Christ: we need to follow him as He expects us to. James and John had not yet learned his message of love and forgiveness as they asked "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from Heaven to reduce them to ashes". (Lk. 9:54). There were others also called by the Lord but they were not yet ready to completely part with their family bonds. To follow Christ and accomplish our mission, we must do it free from any ties.

At a World Missionary Journey, John Paul II made an appeal to all Catholics to become missionaries of the Gospel of Christ through dialogue and forgiveness. His Holiness said that only our love for God can unite men of every race and culture by making the painful divisions disappear, the ideological contrasts, the economic inequalities and the violent abuse humans are still subject to. Through evangelization, we believers may help men to recognize one another as brothers. If we truly feel like brothers, we may start by understanding each other and debating always with respect. His Holiness has emphasized that our determination for an attentive and respectful dialogue is a necessary condition for the true testimony of God's saving love, because who forgives is already opening his heart to his fellowmen and is able to feel love. In the Last Supper the Lord said it too "A new command I give you. Love one another as I have loved you". By this all men will know that you are my disciples. (Jn. 13:34-35).

To evangelize is a task for all of us, although in different ways. For some of us, it will mean going to countries where Christ is still unknown. Others will be supposed to evangelize in their own environment. Let us ask ourselves whether those around us know how to live the fundamental truths of our faith and whether we are already doing something to remedy this situation. We all can and must support the missionary tasks with our prayer, sacrifice and behavior, in addition to the testimony of our forgiveness and understanding towards the rest of our fellowmen.

Our current mission as a parish is to evangelize by supporting our church and volunteering at our St. James Annual Feast. We ask you to invite your families, friend and neighbors to come to our special Masses, support our efforts and enjoy our feast!

13th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21 Elijah the prophet followed God's instruction to appoint a man named Elisha as his successor. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha, who went and said good-bye to his family, then followed Elijah without question.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18 Paul reminds us that people were freed from the old law through Christ. But he makes it clear that this freedom does not mean giving in to evil desires. Instead, we must be guided by the Spirit and most importantly love our neighbor as ourselves.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62 Jesus set out for Jerusalem, and passed through a town where he was not welcomed. He reprimanded his disciples for desiring vengeance against the town. One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.

Readings for Next Week

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18 Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20 Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

The price of a niche is \$2,500, which gives you the right to inter the cremains of two people. If you have been thinking of purchasing a niche, and would like to schedule an appointment, please contact Mrs. Maureen Larkin at 845-225-2079 on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. May the Lord who has blessed this project now be a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

**Skin Cancer
Warning Signs and Prevention**

The beginning of the alphabet provides with a tool for remembering the early warning signs of skin cancer-**ABCD!**

A-Asymmetry-common moles are usually round and symmetrical.

B-Border-skin cancers may have uneven borders.

C-Color-watch for varied shades of brown, tan or black as well as red, white and even blue!

D-Diameter-if a spot is bigger than the head of a pencil eraser, it could be trouble.

Because skin cancer can take many forms, take all skin changes seriously. You should examine your entire body every three months. A change in a mole, a skin growth that increases in size, or a spot that scabs or itches are all reasons to be examined by a doctor.

As with all things, prevention is the best medicine. Wear sunglasses with UV protection and apply sunscreen.

Studies have shown that sunscreen can prevent skin cancer. Sunscreen isn't magic though, using it does! Apply it in advance of sun exposure. Reapply frequently and use broad spectrum products with a high SPF.

Remember that the sun is the most dangerous between 10AM and 4PM. Damaging sun rays can get through clothes. Tight weave, loose-fitting clothes in darker colors offer the most protection.

Do not use tanning booths-they are more damaging than the sun!
