From the Desk of Fr. Kurpios

July 17, 2016

In today's Gospel, we can see a divine as well as a human Jesus. He is tired of his journey and lets the Bethania family He loves so much welcome him. He will take advantage of this moment to let us know "what matters the most".

In the attitude of these two sisters we can detect two different ways of living the Christian vocation: the active or the contemplative life. Mary "who sat down at the Lord's feet", while Martha was busying herself with plenty of chores was happy, but tired. Jesus tells Martha, "you worry and are troubled about many things, but you must have a rest and even more, you must rest by my side, looking at me, listening to me". These two different models of Christian life we must coordinate and integrate: to live Martha's way as much as Mary's way. We have to be attentive to Lord's word, and at the same time, alert for, more often than not, the noise and daily bustle that may hide God's presence. Because a Christian's life and strength can only stay firm and grow if he maintains close ties with the true vine, where his life, his love, his yearning to go on, and not look back, comes from.

Most of us have been called by God to be like "Martha" but we should not forget that the Lord wants us to be more and more like "Mary" too. Jesus Christ has also called us "to choose the best part" and to let no one take it from us. He reminds us that most importantly is not what we can do, but God's word, that lightens our lives by impregnating our works and deeds with the Holy Spirit's love.

To rest in the Lord is only possible if we can enjoy the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Let us remember the name of John Paul II's last encyclical, *The Church lives from Eucharist*. Our Lord has many things to tell us. Let us, therefore, seek those moments of silence and peace, to help us find Jesus again and, in him, to find ourselves once more. Jesus Christ invites us today to take an option, to choose "the better part" (Lk 10:42).

16th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.

Readings for Next Week

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

Abraham pleads with the Lord, who planned to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah because of the evil and sin in those cities. Abraham asks him if he would spare the city if fifty, forty, thirty, twenty or even only ten innocent people were found there. God says that he would spare the cities even for the sake of only ten.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Paul explains to the Colossians that through baptism, they are raised to life with Christ because they believed in the power of the God who raised him from the dead.

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

Jesus' disciples asked him how they should pray. He gave them some phrases similar to those now used in The Lord's Prayer.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. May the Lord who has blessed this project now be a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

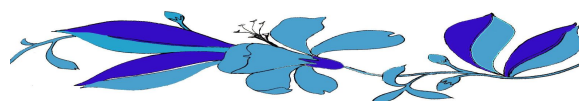

From the Parish Nurse

Heat Emergencies

Heat emergencies are categorized based on severity of symptoms and include: heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke. Although children, elderly and obese individuals are at a higher risk of developing heat illness, it can happen to anyone. Medication and alcohol intake may also place some people at higher risk. If not addressed, heat cramps can progress to heat exhaustion or heat stroke. Heat stroke can develop into heat shock which can lead to brain and organ damage and death. Heat emergencies are caused by prolonged exposure to extreme heat. Precipitating factors can include dehydration, alcohol use, heart disease, high temperatures and humidity, extreme exercise, wearing too much clothing for the weather, sweat gland problems and certain medications such as beta-blockers, diuretics, neuroleptics, phenothiazines, and anticholinergics.

Early Symptoms of Heat Illness include:

Profuse sweating, fatigue, thirst, muscle cramps

If left untreated, can progress to:

Headache, dizziness or lightheadedness, weakness

Nausea and vomiting, cool, moist skin, dark urine

Severe Symptoms may include:

High Fever (above 103), irrational behavior

Extreme confusion, dry, hot red skin, rapid, shallow breathing, rapid weak pulse, seizures,

unconsciousness

What to do

1. Have the person lie down in a cool place-elevate legs
2. Apply cool, wet cloths directly to skin (neck, groin, and armpits) direct a fan on the person
3. If alert, give sips of Gatorade or make a salted drink (1teaspoon of salt per quart of water) and have them sip a half cup every 15 minutes
4. If person shows signs of shock (bluish lips and fingernails), call 911 immediately and give first aid as needed

Call 911

If person shows change in alertness

If fever is above 102

If person becomes unconscious

If pulse is rapid and faint or breathing is rapid or shallow
