The price of a niche is \$2,500, which gives you the right to inter the cremains of two people. If you have been thinking of purchasing a niche, and would like to schedule an appointment, please call Mrs. Maureen Larkin at 845-225-2079 on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. We pray that the Lord who has blessed this project, become a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

From the Parish Nurse



Breast Cancer

Breast cancer is cancer that forms in the tissues (duct and gland tissue) of the breast. Although it is more common in women, it is not only a female disease. **It is the second leading cause of cancer death in women (lung cancer is the first)** (*first among Hispanic women, second among white, black, Asian/Pacific Islander, and American Indian/Alaska Native women) In women, the median age of diagnosis is 61 and statistics show that about 12% of the women born today will be diagnosed with breast cancer at some point in their lives. That equates to about 1 in 8 women. Breast cancer is the most common non-skin cancer diagnosis.

Certain risk factors exist that increase the incidence of breast cancer:

1. Being a woman, age 60 or above
2. Personal health history-having breast cancer in one breast increases risk of getting the disease in the opposite breast
3. Family history-diagnosis of breast cancer in mother, father, sister or daughter, or if a family member was diagnosed under the age of 50. In addition, risk increases if a family member was diagnosed with ovarian cancer
4. Genome changes-Changes in the BRCA1 or BRCA2 gene
5. History of having radiation therapy to the chest area before the age of 30.
6. Reproductive and menstrual history:
 - A. The older a woman is when she has her first child
 - B. Not having children
 - C. Menarche (first menstrual period) before age 12
 - D. Menopause after the age of 55
 - E. Using hormone replacement therapy many years
7. Race-increased incidence in white women
8. Dense breast tissue
9. History of taking DES
10. Being overweight after menopause
11. Lack of physical exercise
12. Drinking alcohol
