From the Desk of the Principal

The truth...in order to fully prepare children for the coming year and subsequent years we must adhere to what is expected by the State of New York because our students must be prepared for their next academic step. To abandon New York State curriculum can be crippling for a student entering high school or college because these institutions strictly follow every aspect of the curriculum set forth by the state and that curriculum happens to be Common Core at the moment. It is a disservice to children and academically irresponsible to abandon curriculum for the sake of marketing.

Saint James the Apostle School does follow Common Core and we believe that our children are confidently meeting the curriculum with great success. But we do differ on many key points and while we follow the curriculum set forth by the state we also keep those things that have worked for us over the past 60 plus years. These are things that make us stand apart from any other school in the area and where we begin is where we began...our faith.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. May the Lord who has blessed this project now be a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

Back to School Bullying

2013 Amendments to Dignity for All Students Act

Amendments to the Dignity Act include a direct response to Cyber bullying defined as: Harassment through electronic communication-including incidents that occur off school property.

Reports of Harassment, Bullying and Discrimination
The Principal, superintendent or designee must be charged with receiving reports.

Investigation of Reports: The Principal, Superintendent or designee must lead or supervise the prompt and thorough investigation of reports.

Response to Verified Reports: The school must take prompt actions to reasonably end the harassment, bullying or discrimination.

Employee Reporting: School employees who witness or receive a report of harassment must notify the principal, superintendent, or designee within one day after receiving the report. This must be followed by a written report within two days.

Notification of law Enforcement: The Principal, Superintendent or designee will be required to notify local law enforcement when they believe any harassment, bullying or discrimination constitutes criminal conduct.

Professional Certification: Professionals applying for certificate or license including (but not limited to) teachers, counselors, psychologists, school social workers, school administrators, supervisors or superintendents must complete harassment training.

Curriculum: Must include safe and responsible use of the internet and electronic communications and emphasize discouraging acts of harassment, bullying and discrimination.

Guidance and Educational Materials: The State Education Department will provide guidance and educational materials, including best practices in addressing cyber bullying, and best practices in helping families and communities work cooperatively with schools in addressing cyber bullying.
