## **From the Pastor's Desk**

**June 5, 2016**

I have just returned from the 8th grade trip to Philadelphia and it was a delightful experience. I want to brag a little about Catholic Education and St. James School in particular. I have spent 32 of the 40 years that I have been a priest in Catholic Education so, needless to say, it is a topic near and dear to my heart. I have seen many schools in the process, some good, some not as good as others, some great and some exceptional. In many areas of the city they are the only schools truly educating all the children in their charge. In all cases their rate of students who go on to and graduate from high school is exceptional. In all of the schools I have seen, in good areas and in areas not quite as good, I have seen one thing that runs true through all and that is concern for the individual and a desire to pass on something more than simple academics. We in Catholic Education can speak openly about things other than "Common Core" and seek to instill morals, virtues and values. While I am sure that such things happen in the public sector, we in Catholic Education do not have to explain our actions or use round about means to get our message across. We can openly seek to support and reinforce the morals and values that parents try to instill at home. We can openly seek and offer alternatives to what the public has to offer or what society says is OK. We can seek to support the individual, reinforce and nurture character and good behavior in all that we say and do openly, without reservation and without explanation. The student who enters one of our schools leaves a better "person" not simply a more educated one. Are their failures? Of course there are, but the successes far surpass that number.

About St. James School: I walk the halls of the school often during the course of the week. I drop in, unexpectedly, into classrooms, the teachers not knowing when or if I will stop by and observe what is going on. I have always found the students "on task", doing work, engaged in their study, whatever it may be. I have also witnessed their learning about their duties as Christians and good citizens, of their responsibilities to themselves, to their peers, their families and their communities. Whether it is during Thanksgiving time or Christmas or whatever, these young people are thought to have concern for their fellow beings. Sometimes they have humbled me in their respect for one another and those around them. During this 8th grade trip I watched as the students donated "Blessing Bags", little bags with the necessities of hygiene and such, to a home for women down on their luck. They also made a donation to that home and gave other things, boxes of the ordinary things needed in life to maintain hygiene and dignity. I saw those boxes being filled during the Christmas season by the 8th grade who, instead of having a "Secret Santa" gave things that they thought the less fortunate among us needed and explaining why they donated what they did. The academic excellence that I see in St. James School I take for granted. My nephew graduated from St. James so I know what, and how, he was taught. I am thankful for that, but I am just, if not more so, proud of the young man he has grown into. Certainly his family has had a large hand in that formation but, his teachers have played just as important a role in that development. I cannot say enough about the men and women who make up the faculty and staff of St. James School. I say that as the pastor, an educator and as a person whose family has benefitted from their kindness, generosity, support and guidance over the years, even when that process seemed to be strict. As the school year ends I believe that I had to make my sentiments public and say "thank you" in a public forum. Many of us fail to do so.

### **Today's Readings** **Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

#### **First Reading: 1 Kings 17:17-24**

The child of the mistress of the house where Elijah sojourned became ill and died. The woman pleaded with Elijah who took the son and prayed over him. When the child revived Elijah returned him to his mother who recognized Elijah as "a man of God."

#### **Second Reading: Galatians 1:11-19**

Paul proclaims the gospel, not as human, but coming from the revelation of Jesus Christ. Paul continues to acknowledge his own sinfulness and call to grace.

#### **Gospel: Luke 7:11-17**

The gospel continues to recount the miracles and healing powers of Jesus. As Jesus neared the gates to the city of Nain, they came upon a deceased young man who was being carried out of the city. His mother, a widow, and a large crowd accompanying the body, met Jesus on the way. Compassionately, Jesus comforts the weeping mother and restores life to the dead man.

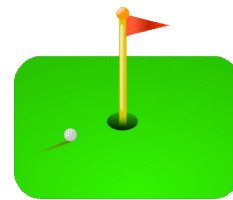
### **ST. SEBASTIAN'S TERRACE AND COLUMBARIUM**

The price of a niche is \$2,500, which gives you the right to inter the remains of two people. If you have been thinking of purchasing a niche, and would like to schedule an appointment, please contact Mrs. Maureen Larkin at 845-225-2079 on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. May the Lord who has blessed this project now be a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

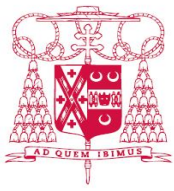

**From the Parish Nurse**

**Skin Cancer**

The summer is coming! With the longer sunlit days and our desire to spend more time out of doors, we have to think about saving our skin!

**Did you know?**

1. Skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the United States.
2. More than 3.5 million cases are diagnosed annually in 2 million people.
3. Each year there are more new skin cancers diagnosed than the combined incidence of breast, prostate, lung, and colon cancer.
4. One in five Americans will develop skin cancer over a lifetime.
5. Basal Cell Carcinoma (BCC) is the most common form of skin cancer. It is rarely fatal, but can be disfiguring.
6. Squamous Cell Cancer (SCC) is the 2<sup>nd</sup> most common form of skin cancer. About 700,000 new cases are diagnosed yearly resulting in 2500 deaths.
7. BCC and SCC are the only two major forms of non-melanoma skin cancer and between 40-50% of Americans who live to age 65 will have either one at least once.
8. 90% of non-melanoma skin cancers are associated with ultraviolet radiation from the sun.
9. 90% of visible changes attributed to aging are caused by sun exposure.

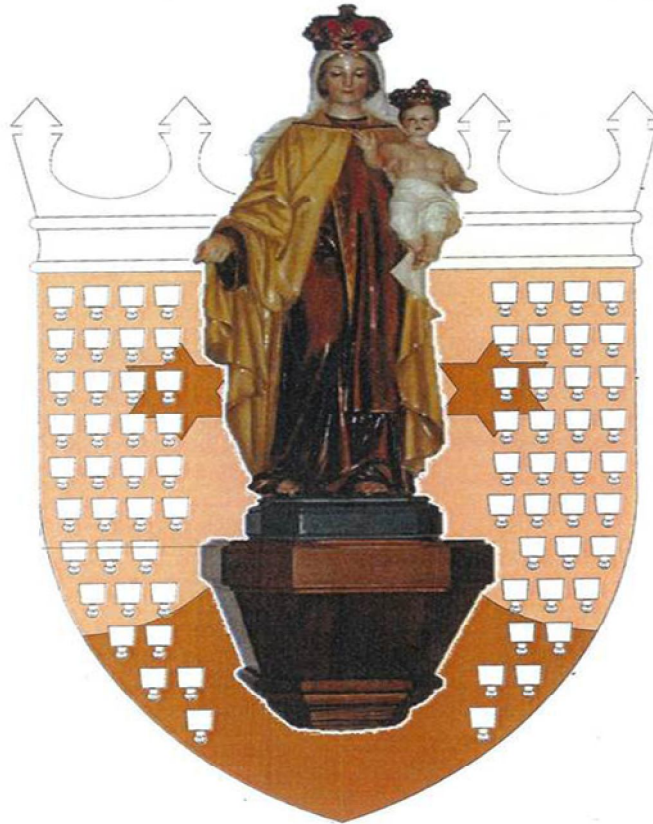
