## **From the Pastor's Desk**

**September 4, 2016**

I find that, as I get older, I tend to refer back to "when I was a boy" days. Oddly enough, when I was younger I always found that tedious in "older" priests. Now I find that I am that "older priest" and have become all that I never thought I would be. Church etiquette and decorum have bothered me for a while. When I was a boy the thought of talking in church or having something in my mouth while I was in church was truly un-thinkable. Church was a place for prayer and meditation, but at the least, quiet. It seems that church has become more of a meeting place than a place of prayer and meditation, to say nothing of quiet. Conversations take place right up to the entrance of the priest at Mass, and sometimes beyond that. Water bottles, coffee, and snacks seem to be considered okay, and not among the very young, but among people who should know better. Cell phones are common among all of us, even I have had to surrender to their use, and sometimes we all forget to turn off or silence our phones during Mass, but to answer a call is something else. As you know, young children talking, walking about and such doesn't bother me. That kind of behavior on the part of people old enough to know better really does.

I believe that this change in behavior and Church etiquette has come about because we no longer focus on things "higher" than ourselves. While we are good people we tend to place our own wants and desires first and believe that they are what God really wants. An excellent example of what I am referring to is the relatively new phenomenon of the "eulogy" at a funeral Mass. We seem to forget what the focus of the Mass of Christian Burial is really all about and, once again, focus on our own need. The Mass takes on the attitude of an after-thought rather than being the center of what we are there for. The burial of a Catholic loved one is divided into three sections, each one important in its own right. The wake is to focus in on the life that was. All of the good things our loved one has done in his/her life. All of the people they have touched and the legacy that they will leave behind. This is the proper place for a eulogy. The Mass centers on the New Life in Christ that our loved one experiences now. The Resurrection and our hope and certainty in that promise, is what the Mass is all about. In all of the eulogies I have heard I can only recall two that have even mentioned the faith and believe in the promise of the resurrection on the part of the deceased and the family. I have heard all that the loved one meant to the individual. In almost every eulogy I have heard nothing of the real purpose that we are gathered in a church to celebrate the Life in Christ of the deceased. Obviously everyone in the congregation knows what kind of good person the deceased was, that's why they are present. They don't need to be reminded of that fact. To make sense out of the tragedy that is death, words of faith and hope are necessary, not mere happy memories.

If we are to bring about a renewal of the sense of "mystery" and awe, a true sense of prayer and belief in a loving God, that can only be done if we change ourselves first: A return to an understanding that we are not the centers of the universe but exist in a world in which we all live and have our being; A true belief in a being higher than ourselves and an understanding that we are all on the road to salvation together; Each one respectful of one another, each one truly making the "Golden Rule" part of our very being.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. We pray that the Lord who has blessed this project, become a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

**EHI Annual Walkathon**

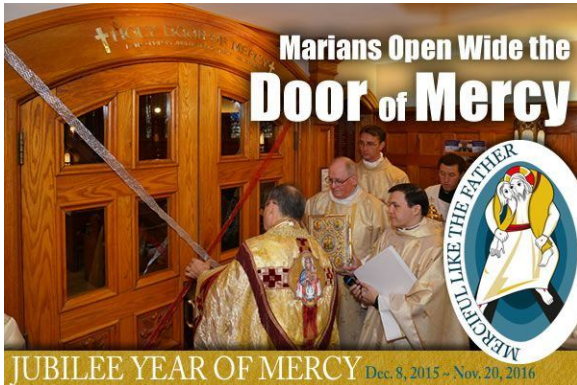

# Saint James Parish Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Divine Mercy

Saturday, October 15, 2016



Pope Francis inaugurated the extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy on Dec. 8, urging the faithful to come to know the face of God's mercy — Jesus Christ — and to show that face of mercy to our friends, neighbors, and enemies alike.

"This extraordinary Holy Year is itself a gift of grace," Pope Francis said in his homily for the Jubilee's opening Mass, just before opening the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. Only hours later, the Marian Fathers in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, opened a newly installed Holy Door of their own at the inside entrance to the National Shrine of The Divine Mercy. Indeed,

at the request of Pope Francis, for the first time in the 700-year-old tradition of Jubilee years, dioceses around the world opened their own Holy Doors at specific pilgrimage locations.

The Shrine in Stockbridge was selected by the Most Rev. Mitchell T. Rozanski, the bishop of the Diocese of Springfield, Massachusetts, to be among the dioceses official Jubilee Year destinations.
