From the Desk of the Pastor

October 2, 2016

The leaves are turning and once again announce the coming of dreaded winter. I always get in a reflective mood around this time. Perhaps it is because it's a little darker outside or perhaps it is the cold and the desire to cuddle up in something warm. I really don't know.

The gospel for this Sunday is Christ reminding us what we are to do, and why, with our lives. I remember when I was a young boy asking my father why I had chores to do. He looked at me with a puzzled look and responded, "Why do you think we had you?" Another warm fuzzy moment with my dad! He went on to explain that doing chores, going to school, getting good grades and helping out in the family was my job, my responsibility. The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all.

We have celebrated Mass at the Altar of our Terrace and Columbarium many times. There are 90 niches engraved and interred. The price of a niche is \$2,500, which gives you the right to inter the cremains of two people. If you have been thinking of purchasing a niche, and would like to schedule an appointment, please call Mrs. Maureen Larkin at 845-225-2079 on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. We pray that the Lord who has blessed this project, become a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

Childhood Obesity

Healthy Childcare Settings

Many working parents depend on childcare during work hours or after school. Some of the things to consider when choosing healthy setting:

1. Ask providers about their approach to promoting healthy lifestyles in children.
2. Visit the setting to see how providers model and teach physical activity, good nutrition and healthy sleep practices.
3. Does the provider collaborate with parents and family to promote a healthy environment both inside and outside of the home and childcare setting?
4. Does the provider support breastfeeding (breast milk storage and handling)?
