From the Desk of Fr. Szymon

October 16, 2016

Today, Jesus reminds us that "we should pray continually and not lose heart" (Lk 18:1). He teaches with his deeds and with his words. St. Luke appears before us as the evangelist of Jesus' prayers. Quite so! In some of the scenes, where the authors inspired in the Holy Scriptures depict Jesus' life, only Luke presents him in the act of praying.

During Jesus' Baptism in the river Jordan, when choosing the Twelve and at the Transfiguration, a disciple asks him "Lord, teach us to pray" (Lk 11:1), from his lips comes out the Lord's Prayer. Then He announces his negations to Peter: "I have prayed that your own faith may not fail" (Lk 22:32). At the crucifixion: "Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do"". (Lk 23:34). When He dies on the Cross: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit" (Lk 23:46). After the description of all evangelists, the same Lord is a model of the petition prayer, especially at the Gethsemane garden.

I could point out how I will raise my heart towards God while in different activities, because it is not the same intellectual work than manual labor. To be in a church or to be in the sports field or at home; to drive in the city or on a turnpike; it is not the same - our petition prayer than our gratitude; adoration than pleading forgiveness; early in the morning than late, after a whole day's work. Saint Josemaría Escrivá gives us a recipe for the petition prayer: "He who gets more is he who pesters much... Therefore, draw closer to God: try harder to be a saint".

Readings for This Week – 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites. Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. Two men helped him keep his hands raised and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14—4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.

For those of you not familiar with a Columbarium, it is a Latin word that describes a collection of niches to house urns containing cremated human remains. Usually inscribed with the person's name and dates of birth and death, columbaria are constructed to serve as permanent resting places for our loved ones in a 'churchyard' or landscaped terrace. We pray that the Lord who has blessed this project, become a final resting place for many of our loved ones.

Breast Cancer



Some of the signs and symptoms of breast cancer to be aware of are the following:

- A lump or thickening in or near the breast or underarm area
- Changes in the shape or size of the breast
- Dimpling or puckering of the skin of the breast
- Changes in the nipple that may cause it to become inverted
- Discharge (especially blood) from the nipple
- Scaly, red, swollen skin on the breast

Having one or more of these symptoms does not indicate that you have breast cancer, but it does warrant investigation by your physician.

My name is Isabelle Andreo. I live with my Mother, Father and Sisters, Danielle (16), and Michelle (11). I attend George Fisher Middle School and I have earned high honor roll all four quarters of the 2015-2016 school year. During my spare time I play soccer on the Carmel Spartans and twirl for the Silver Starlites.

I think being a Catholic is important because of love and faith for God extend outside and past the one hour we spend at church each Sunday. Our faith appears in our daily lives and we show our love to God in our daily actions. My Grandmother has been a good example of a Catholic to me.
